Example: The program has made progress but has not met the academic objectives for math and English Language Arts. Individual targeted assistance and tutoring sessions might be helpful based on information provided by regular-school day teachers. It is recommended to communicate consistently with the regular school day teachers to coordinate support and share progress. Based upon data analysis, the program will use the following interventions to revise the program and activities. 1) The program will develop a portfolio for each student that includes student goals and progress. 2) The program will use project based learning to facilitate connections between learning and the real-world. 3) The program will provide families with appropriate activities to use with their child at home. 4) The program will schedule time for conferences with the 21st CCLC staff and regular school day teachers.
The evaluator observed a site manager having a stand up meeting with a parent and child regarding report cards. The site manager met with the school teacher and provided an update to the parent of the plan that the school teacher and site manager are putting in place to improve the student's outcomes and behavior. She then proceeded to provide positive reinforcement and encouragement to the student. All of this took place really quick during parent pick up and sign out.	The program should consider having this site manager work as a peer mentor and provide quick workshops on communicating effectively with parents. This interaction was a quick yet powerful exemplar moment for how to present information that was not very positive, in a positive manner.

It is highly recommended for site managers to engage as often as biweekly with teachers of regularly attending students. It is recommended for parents, teachers, and managers to address the students' concerns. It is recommended for individual attention to be placed on students' areas of weakness.	mastery of weakness.
